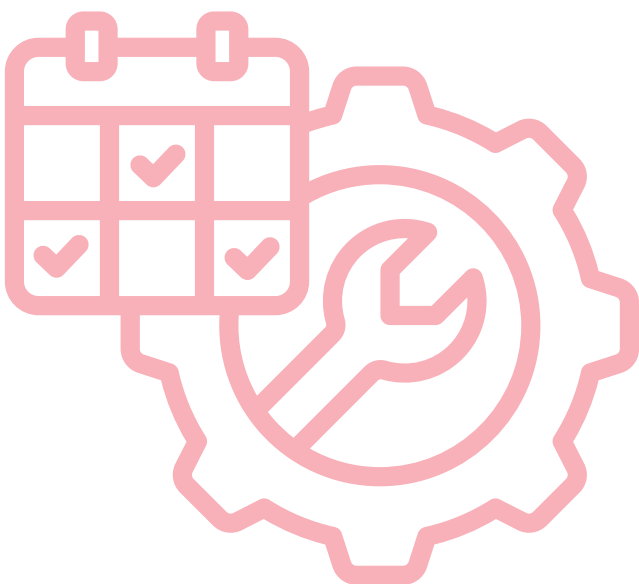

2. Get to Know you're Highlander: What Makes It Unique?

2016 was a reputable year for the Highlander. Its optional third row seating was one of the best feature that came with the car. It also came with multiple trim levels. The engine options were also good 2.7-liter 4-cylinder or the 3.5-liter V6 engine. AWD, touchscreen navigation, and enhanced safety features were set options.

What it means for your maintenance:

- 1.The V6 requires frequent oil inspection in situations where you drive it hard.
- 2.AWD call for regular inspection of differential and transfer case fluids.
- 3.Cabin filters must be changed more often if you use rear vents for the third row.
- 4.Knowing these facts will lead you to focus on what your particular trim level needs

3. Maintenance Schedule Simplified

Here's a down-to-earth look at when to do what. We're not quoting a factory manual here—this is real-world advice:

Every 5,000 miles:

Oil change, tire rotation, fluid top-offs, brake inspection

Every 15,000 miles:

Cabin air filter, engine air filter, battery terminals check

Every 30,000 miles:

Transmission fluid (especially for towing), coolant check, fuel system cleaning

Every 60,000 miles:

Brake pads and rotors likely due, spark plugs (for 4-cyl), suspension bushings check

Every 100,000 miles:

Water pump, serpentine belt, spark plugs (for V6), and full cooling system inspection

Don't rely solely on warning lights. Stick to mileage—and check your oil once a month no matter what.



4. Common Wear Parts and When to Replace Them

Here are the usual suspects that fail on the 2016 Highlander as it racks up miles:

- **Brakes** – Expect rotor wear by 60,000 miles, especially on AWD trims.
- **Alternator** – Some V6 models start seeing alternator issues around 90K miles.
- **Water Pump** – A known weak point, especially in hot climates.
- **Radiator Fans** – Failure around 100K if the A/C is heavily used.
- **Suspension** – Rear shocks and front struts often need replacing around 75K–90K miles.
- **Door Locks/Actuators** – Common electronic glitch in this model's design.

If something gives out, it doesn't always make sense to go new. In fact, that's where we come in.
